Project description

The project supports the maintenance of existing solar home system (SHS) installations and the continued expansion of distributed renewable energy programs. The ability of Infrastructure Development Company Ltd (IDCOL) to sustain SHS operations independently was challenged due to the poor economic conditions in recent years that have triggered higher rates of household defaults on the SHS financing, which in turn limited IDCOL's implementing partners' ability to recover their capital. This forced some of those partners to stop delivering on after-sale operations and maintenance of SHS units. The drag on their financial position also reduced loan payments to IDCOL.

The result-based carbon finance payments will ensure that beneficiaries continue to reap full benefits from SHS that supply reliable and affordable off-grid renewable energy and prevent the SHS from ending up in disrepair before its retirement date, which may jeopardize the results of the original program, despite the upfront capital investments made.

The World Bank's "Carbon Initiative for Development" (Ci-Dev), in which the Climate Cent Foundation holds a share, is purchasing 1'016'583 certificates issued under the World Bank's "Standardised Crediting Framework" (SCF) for emission reductions generated over the period 2021 to 2024.

Project status (July 2026)

The project was registered by Bangladesh under the SCF in 2025.

The project ensures the operation of 3.3 million solar home systems installed.
